It was an incredible event which touched the audiences who gave up their weekend to be inspired by the storytellers who revealed engaging and moving insights into family, ambition, determination and hardship.

The storytelling initiative was produced by the NSW Multicultural Health Communication Service (MHCS) in collaboration with the NSW Organ and Tissue Donation Service, Performance 4A and Co.As.It. to increase awareness and highlight the importance of organ and tissue donation in multicultural communities.

Pink Sari Project Wins Excellence of Innovation Award

The Pink Sari Project has won the iiHUB Director's Award for Excellence at the 2015 South Eastern Sydney Local Health District (SESLHD) Improvement Awards in July.

The Pink Sari Project is a community initiative led by MHCS in partnership with BreastScreen NSW and Refugee Health Service and funded by the Cancer Institute NSW with the support of the University of Technology Sydney which aims to increase awareness of low participation rates in the BreastScreen NSW program among Indian and Sri Lankan women in NSW.

Since the project's launch in September 2014 to August 2015, there has been a marked increase in breast screen participation for women 50-79 who speak Tamil or Hindi in NSW. This is a clear indication that the approaches undertaken for this campaign have been effective.

The success of the Pink Sari Project is greatly due to the support of the Indian and Sri Lankan communities who have embraced this initiative whole heartedly.

Portraits in Pink Photo Exhibition

The Pink Sari Project held a photo exhibition-first entitled Portraits in Pink from 24th August to 7th September at the Blacktown Arts Centre which featured portraits of 14 breast cancer survivors taken by 14 professional photographers from Indian and Sri Lankan backgrounds.

The photographers have volunteered their time to address a "culture of silence" on breast cancer in the two communities which, according to the Cancer Institute NSW, have some of the lowest screening rates for breast cancer in the state.

A special media viewing of the exhibition was held on 27th August which was attended by breast cancer survivors, partner community organisations, stakeholders, media and Pink Sari Project supporters.
