

Your child may need to see a Speech Pathologist if they:

- Do not understand questions or directions.
- Cannot express themselves using words or sentences like other children their age.
- Have not begun to say words by 12 months.
- Have speech that is difficult to understand.
- Stutter or repeat sounds, words or phrases.
- Have a husky or unclear voice.
